CITY OF TAYLOR WELCOMES NEW HR DIRECTOR

Following a national search for a new Director of Human Resources and Civil Service, City Manager Brian LaBorde is pleased to announce that the City of Taylor has selected LaShon Gros for the position. Ms. Gros (pronounced GRO) most recently served as a Human Resources Generalist for the City of Killeen. She will begin her new duties with the City of Taylor on January 4, 2021, taking over the position from Kim Peterson, who recently announced her retirement. Ms. Peterson started working for the City of Taylor in 2015, after serving for 10 years as a human resources professional for numerous municipalities and government agencies in Texas and California.

Ms. Gros holds a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from the University of Maryland University College, and also holds Master's degrees in Human Resources Management from the Keller Graduate School of Management and Organizational Leadership from Columbia Southern University. She earned her certification from the Society for Human Resources Management (SHRM) in 2019. Prior to working for the City of Killeen, Ms. Gros served a Human Resources Manager Internship for TransTech Fabrication, LLC and held numerous positions,

including Human Resources Manager, for the U.S. Army. She is affiliated with the Society of Human Resources Management (SHRM) and the Texas Municipal Human Resources Association (TMHRA).

Ms. Gros will be responsible for administering all human resource management functions including the recruitment and processing of all new employees; compensation, benefits and employee relations; and ensuring that the City's programs, records and procedures comply with all federal and state laws governing such personnel practices. In addition, Ms. Gros will be responsible for making recommendations to City Council and management concerning all human resource related matters. Ms. Gros will serve as the City Civil Service Director; and Secretary to the Civil Service Commission and will perform work incidental to the civil service system as required by the Commission and Chapter 143 of the Texas Local Government Code.

TEMPORARY SUSPENSIONS OF SERVICE DISCONNECTS ENDING IN JANUARY

When COVID-19 came to Taylor, the City recognized that this could make it hard for some of our utility customers to stay current on their utility bills so the Finance Department temporarily suspended utility service disconnects and the assessing of late fees.

The temporary suspension of service disconnects and the waiver of the late fees that the City of Taylor implemented as a response to COVID-19 is ending soon. Beginning with the January billing cycle, the City will be reinstating the normal practice of charging late fees and disconnecting service for customers who have delinquent utility bills. If your utility bill is delinquent, please contact the Utility Billing department at 512-352-2066 to discuss your options.

CITY OF TAYLOR WASTEWATER AVERAGING

As a reminder, the City of Taylor conducts its annual sewer averaging from late November through March. The months that are used are typically the lowest consumption months of the year. These three months are averaged to get the sewer rates for the next 12 months.

Prior to the averaging period you are advised to repair any leaky faucets or running toilets and any other water leaks. This will avoid a high usage month during the averaging period and help to keep your sewer rate down.

RESIDENTS MAY NEED TO REGISTER CARPORT

Do you have a carport that was built between April 2001 and June 2020? If so, you may need to register it with the City of Taylor to ensure it can remain in place. If your carport was constructed during the timeframe above and did not receive a City permit, you need to contact the City of Taylor Development Services Department to register your carport and receive a safety inspection.

The City is offering a waiver of the permit and inspection fee for those residents who register their carports and receive a safety inspection prior to June 1, 2021. Residents who do not meet the June 1, 2021 deadline may be required to remove their carport or seek a special permit and pay permitting and inspection fees.
