With the summer season just around the corner, I wanted to take a moment to highlight our beautiful Taylor Parks system. With plenty of picnic areas, playgrounds, and open space for outdoor activities,

our parks are the perfect place to gather with family and friends for a summer day of fun.

On May 13, it is my pleasure to announce that we will hold a ribbon cutting ceremony for the latest addition to Murphy Park: the soccer mini pitch located next to the basketball court. The Parks and Recreation Department worked with Soccer Assist, along with the U.S. Soccer Foundation, 4ATX, and St. David's Foundation, to build the mini pitch after they were approached by Soccer Assist in 2022. Construction began in April of this year, and was recently completed. We're looking forward to officially opening the mini pitch and celebrating this exciting new amenity in our parks.

The Parks and Recreation Department is also gearing up for a fun-filled summer. The Doris Roznovak Aquatic Center will officially open for the summer season starting Memorial Day Weekend (May 27). The Department is also working on bringing back Movies in the Park to the City of Taylor this summer, with dates set for June 9, July 14 and August 11 in Heritage Square Park. ## Keep Grass Trimmed

The City of Taylor Code Enforcement Office would like to remind Taylor property owners to keep grass and underbrush trimmed on their property and ensure that weeds are pulled.



It's a property owner's responsibility to mow to the back of the curb or edge of pavement and to the midpoint of the alley. Grass may not exceed 12 inches in height and underbrush may not exceed 18 inches in height.

Trees must be trimmed so that the canopy is no lower than 12 feet above the top of the curb, edge of the pavement or edge of alley.

## April Sales Tax Numbers

The City of Taylor has released the actual and cumulative sales tax numbers for the month of March and posted them to the City's website. The sales and use tax revenue reported for the City in April 2023 was \$688,276, an increase of more than \$235,000 (51.9%)

over the same time last year. The cumulative sales and use tax revenue through April 2023 is \$10,753,482, an increase of over \$7.1 million (200.1%) over the same period in 2021. In November 2022, the City began releasing a report on the third Tuesday of every month detailing the cumulative and actual numbers from the last four months of the year and compare them to the three prior years.

Increased sales tax revenue is a positive for Taylor residents for several reasons. A majority of the revenue in the City's General Fund is made up of ad valorem, or property tax that is charged to residents, and sales and use tax that is charged to anyone who purchases goods and services in the City. When sales and use tax revenues are up, it can help lower the property tax rate. Additionally, the increase in

sales tax revenue also helped the City fund limb and debris cleanup efforts due to Winter Storm Mara.

Between the increased construction use taxes from the Samsung Semiconductor construction project, and an influx of visitors and businesses in our City, the City has seen an upward trend in sales and use tax numbers that we expect will continue in the coming years.
