Our Murphy Park Summer Kickoff is June 4. Free pool admission 3-5 PM!

The following week from June 5-9, we'll host free park pop-ups under the Murphy Park Pavilion every morning from 10 AM - Noon.

Activities provided for kids of all ages, including Giant Connect 4, Giant Jenga, hula hoops, cornhole and more! Play basketball, tennis, and also check out our new soccer mini-pitch!

After the park pop-ups, head over to the pool. Normal pool hours are 12-8 PM, and normal fees listed below.

Notes:

1) These are free Murphy Park pop-up events, not a drop-off paid summer camp. Adult supervision required for kids ages 11 and under.

2) The pool opens on May 27th for Memorial Day weekend and will be open every day except Mondays until Labor Day. Normal pool admission prices:

- \$3 for adults and kids ages 13+
- \$2 for kids ages 4-12
- \$2 for seniors 60+
- Free for kids under 3 and under
- Bulk discount: Family Pass for 30 Admissions is \$45.

3) Taylor Parks & Rec is also partnering with Taylor ISD to host free park pop-ups every Tuesday and Thursday evening in June & July from 7-9 PM at Robinson Park.

May Sales Tax Numbers

– The City of Taylor has released the actual and cumulative sales tax numbers for the month of March and posted them to the City's website. The sales and use tax revenue reported for the City in April 2023 was \$688,276, an increase of more than \$235,000 (51.9%)

over the same time last year. The cumulative sales and use tax revenue through April 2023 is \$10,753,482, an increase of over \$7.1 million (200.1%) over the same period in 2021-22. In November 2022, the City began releasing a report on the third Tuesday of every month detailing the cumulative and actual numbers from the last four months of the year and compare them to the three prior years.

Increased sales tax revenue is a positive for Taylor residents for several reasons. A majority of the revenue in the City's General Fund is made up of ad valorem, or property tax that is charged to residents, and sales and use tax that is charged to anyone who purchases goods and services in the City. When sales and use tax revenues are up, it can help lower the property tax rate. Additionally, the increase in sales tax revenue helped the City fund limb and debris cleanup efforts due to Winter Storm Mara.

Between the increased construction use taxes from the Samsung Semiconductor construction project, and an influx of visitors and businesses in our City, the City has seen an upward trend in sales and use tax numbers that we expect will continue in the coming years.
