City Manager Message

I want to congratulate our 2023 LEAD Taylor graduates on completing this year's session. We had 17 residents complete this year's class. Graduation will be held at the City Council meeting on July 13 at 6 PM. I invite everyone to come and congratulate this newest group and I thank them for taking the time to participate in the class this year.

Our LEAD Taylor classes provide information to our residents about the inner workings of their City, school district, economic development and other groups in Taylor. We will be looking for a new group to register starting in September. Budget season is also in full swing. City departments have turned in their FY 2023-24 budgets and management along with the Finance Department has met with each department to go over their budgets and goals for next year.

I wanted to be sure that residents are aware of some important dates that will be coming up. We will first present the preliminary budget to City Council with a brief explanation during the July 13 City Council meeting. A budget workshop which includes a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) review will be held on July 25 in Council Chambers.

During the August 24 meeting, we will set the upper limit tax rate, schedule public hearings and introduce the Budget and Tax Rate Ordinances. A notice of the tax rate will be published on the City's website.

A public hearing will then be held during the September 14 City Council meeting and Council will then adopt the budget. The FY 2023-24 budget will go into effect on October 1, 2023.

The budget process is a critical undertaking that requires meticulous planning, thoughtful consideration, and collaboration from various departments and personnel across the organization.

As we move forward, I am confident that the budget proposal for Fiscal Year 2023-24 will lay a strong foundation for the continued growth and prosperity of our community. I urge our residents to actively participate in the upcoming public hearings and engage with us to ensure that the budget truly reflects their aspirations and needs.

Fourth of July Festivities Planned in Taylor; Closure on Bull Branch Trail



The City of Taylor is excited to partner again with the American Legion Graham D Luhn Post 39 for this year's Fourth of July Fireworks Show. The show is part of a fun-filled day celebrating our nation's independence on Tuesday, July 4, beginning with a parade in the morning.

The parade will begin at 9 a.m. with the procession heading north on Davis Street, down Lake Drive, and finishing in Murphy Park. An Ice Cream Social at the American Legion Hall will follow the parade. Throughout the day there will be food and drinks set up in Murphy Park. Good Life Taylor will also hold an artist's reception for their Art in the Park banner exhibition. There will be live music from the Derailers starting at 7 p.m. at the Murphy Park Pavilion and the fireworks show will commence at sunset.

For this year's fireworks show, fireworks will launch along the greenbelt in Bull Branch Park. A portion of the hike-and-bike trail that connects Bull Branch Park to Murphy Park will be closed starting at 7:30 a.m. on July 4 and ending at 5 a.m. on July 5. We ask that residents be aware of closure signs and barriers and plan an alternate route if they plan to walk or bike into Murphy Park for the festivities.

The Taylor Police Department has two new officers on patrol. Officer Wilfredo Arce II was sworn in on May 18 and Officer Pedro Montoya was sworn in on June 14. Both ceremonies were held at the Taylor Public Library meeting room. Congratulations Officer Arce and Officer Montoya!

June Sales Tax Numbers



The City of Taylor has released the actual and cumulative sales tax numbers for the month of May and posted them to the City's website. The sales and use tax revenue reported for the City in June 2023 was \$2,176,802, an increase of more than \$1.5 million (255.7%) over the same time last year. The cumulative sales and use tax revenue through June 2023 is

\$16,734,644, an increase of over \$11.8 million (241.1%) over the same period in 2021-22. In November 2022, the City began releasing a report on the third Tuesday of every month detailing the cumulative and actual numbers from the last four months of the year and comparing them to the three prior years.

Increased sales tax revenue is a positive for Taylor residents for several reasons. A majority of the revenue in the City's General Fund is made up of ad valorem, or property tax that is charged to residents, and sales and use tax that is charged to anyone who purchases goods and services in the City. When sales and use tax revenues are up, it can help lower the property tax rate. Additionally, the increase in sales tax revenue helped the City fund limb and debris cleanup efforts due to Winter Storm Mara.

Between the increased construction use taxes from the Samsung Semiconductor construction project, and an influx of visitors and businesses in our City, the City has seen an upward trend in sales and use tax numbers that we expect will continue in the coming years.
