City Manager Message

It's hard to believe how quickly this year has flown by-- October is upon us, and the City is looking forward to a busy fall season, with several fun events planned throughout the month and in the months to come.

October also marks the beginning of the new fiscal year for the City of Taylor. The budget theme for FY2024 is "Putting the Pieces Together." We have completed our master plans and now we are moving forward with projects derived from those plans.

I first would like to congratulate our Finance Department for helping to raise our S&P Global Rating from AA- to AA. This rating is a big honor for the city, and it reflects our strong financial management and a robust economic outlook. The City's debt rating was last upgraded to AA- in December 2013. The upgrade in our debt rating will lead to substantial cost savings and enable us to issue debt at significantly lower interest rates. The City's consistent adherence to conservative fiscal practices has significantly contributed to this noteworthy achievement.

The FY2024 budget was crafted to address the escalating demand for services driven by rapid growth and development within our city. Notably, it encompasses increased funding for public safety personnel and additional staffing to streamline the day-to-day operations of our expanding City.

This year's budget also kicks off several exciting new Parks projects, including a new playground at Bull Branch Park, the resurfacing of the Memorial Field track, a new pickleball court, and the reconstruction of the Doris Roznovak Aquatic Center. We are proud of our city's green spaces and recreational activities and we are looking forward to expanding those important amenities for our residents.

In addition, we are pleased to include many needed improvements to our infrastructure in the upcoming budget. They include the reconstruction of existing sidewalks and overlays on Second Street, Fourth Street, and Mallard Street and the

replacement of several school zone lights, speed reader signs, and signage. We will also be making drainage improvements to the Donna Channel, Mustang Creek, Travis, and Franklin.

Taylor residents can be assured that their tax dollars are being put to work in ways that will benefit them for many years to come. I would like to thank staff and our Finance Department for their diligent work over the last few months in putting together this year's budget, and our City Council for planning ahead and funding projects that will benefit generations to come. We look forward to putting the pieces together!

FY 2023-24 Budget Approved

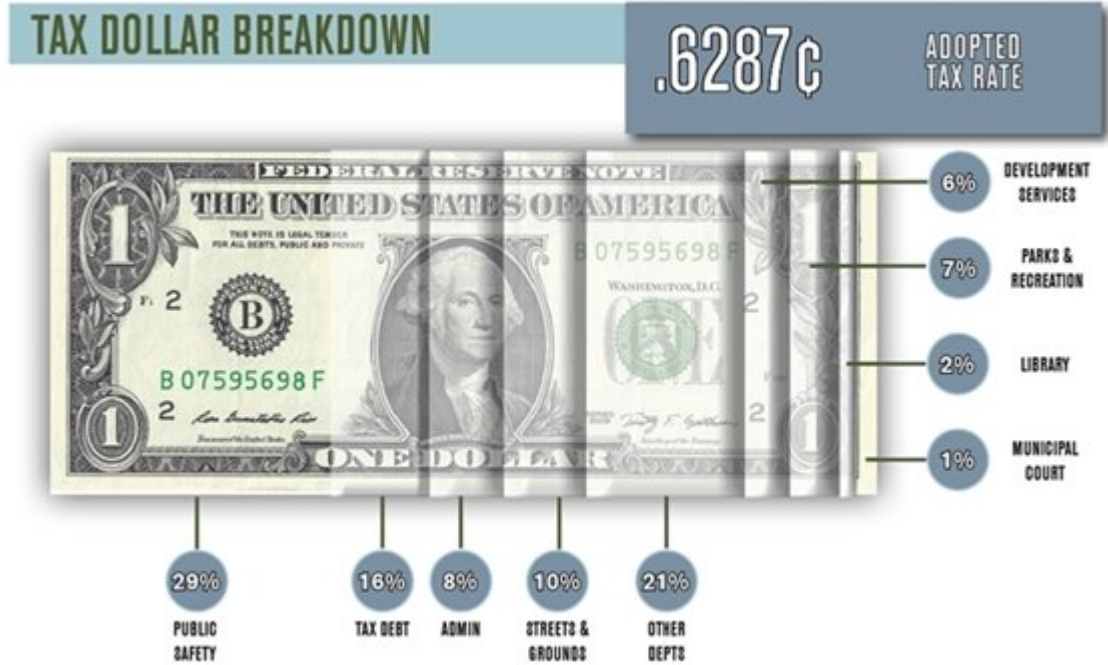
The City of Taylor adopted the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24 budget at the August 24 City Council meeting.

Highlights include:

- Increases the Over 65 and Disabled Persons Exemption by \$10,000 to \$50,000 per household
- Includes a 3% COLA for all employees
- Includes almost \$4.5M in cash-funded equipment and facility upgrades
- Increases funding for programs that provide assistance to senior citizens, winter sheltering and community involvement programs
- Includes the cost of debt issued during FY 2023 that funds improvements to drainage and the construction of a new municipal complex including a justice center

The FY 2023-24 budget allocates \$58.7M to Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) which includes in part overlays on Second Street, Fourth Street and Mallard; Storm Water Master Plan; valve inventory and exercising program; new Bull Branch playground; and Memorial Field track resurface.

Construction on Mallard Lane began in early September and will continue through December. There may be delays on the roadway due to lane closures and one-way traffic. Please be aware of any closures, flaggers, and other workers in the area, and leave some extra travel time if you need to use Mallard Lane.

September Sales Tax Numbers

The City of Taylor has released the actual and cumulative sales tax numbers for the month of September and posted them to the City's website. The sales and use tax revenue reported for the City in September 2023 was \$2,749,238, an increase of more than \$1.8 million (216.8%) over the same time last year. The cumulative sales and use

tax revenue through September 2023 is \$23,886,505, an increase of over \$16.5 million (226%) over the same period in 2021-22. In November 2022, the City began releasing a report on the third Tuesday of every month detailing the cumulative and actual numbers from the last four months of the year and comparing them to the three prior years.

Increased sales tax revenue is a positive for Taylor residents for several reasons. A majority of the revenue in the City's General Fund is made up of ad valorem, or property tax that is charged to residents, and sales and use tax that is charged to anyone who purchases goods and services in the City. When sales and use tax revenues are up, it can help lower the property tax rate. Additionally, the increase in sales tax revenue helped the City fund limb and debris cleanup efforts due to Winter Storm Mara.

Between the increased construction use taxes from the Samsung Semiconductor construction project, and an influx of visitors and businesses in our City, the City has seen an upward trend in sales and use tax numbers that we expect will continue in the coming years.
