June 6 Public Meeting Set for Justice Center Project

A public meeting for the ongoing Justice Center Project will be held on Thursday, June 6, from 5:30-7:30 p.m. in the City Hall Auditorium, 400 Porter St. This will be an opportunity for the public to see the proposed renderings of the layout of the building, provide feedback, and ask questions about the project.



At the public meeting, representatives from Randall Scott Architects will present a rendered site plan, floor plans, exterior renderings, and a fly-around of the proposed design for public review and comment. Those in attendance will have the opportunity to ask questions of both the representatives from Randall Scott Architects and City staff. This meeting will be a follow-up to the initial presentation at the May 9 regular City Council meeting where initial concepts were discussed.

City of Taylor to Host Open House for Drainage and Flood Mitigation Projects on June 26

The City of Taylor will host an open house on Wednesday, June 26, to present details on three drainage and flood mitigation projects. The meeting will be from 5 to 7 p.m. at Taylor Public Library, 801 Vance St., and

will be an open house format with no formal presentation to allow attendees to visit with project managers and come and go at their convenience.

In 2019, the City of Taylor enacted higher standards for their flood control ordinance, enhanced drainage criteria in their subdivision ordinance, and adopted a comprehensive Drainage Master Plan to form a framework for addressing flooding issues. These "Taylor on the Move!" drainage projects are designed to improve drainage issues and address flooding caused by stormwater. The improvement projects include:

Donna Channel Drainage Improvements Project

This project involves drainage improvements to the existing Donna Channel, located within an existing utility easement between Davis Street and Donna Drive. The channel is situated between residential homes south of Mallard Lane and generally flows south, crossing Drake Lane, until its confluence with Bull Branch to the South. The goal of the improvements is to reduce private property flood concerns along streets in the vicinity of the project and private properties along the Donna Channel itself.

Mustang Creek Drainage Improvements Project

The goal of this project is to mitigate streambank erosion threatening the airport runway threshold in the Mustang Creek watershed southwest of the Taylor Municipal Airport and provide approximately 20 acre-feet of overbank flood storage while ensuring no adverse impacts to downstream residents. Mustang Creek headwaters begin north of Hutto and flow southeast through Taylor, crossing State Highway (SH) 79 and eventually flowing to Brushy Creek.

Travis & Franklin Drainage and Flood Improvements Project

Travis and Franklin Streets form a loop road south of West Second Street that primarily serves residential homes and a few businesses. These streets routinely experience ponding due to inadequate roadside drainage ditches and impact some residential homes. The goal is to mitigate the unwanted stormwater impacts and improve drainage infrastructure in the area.

The total cost for all three projects is approximately \$11.5M; however, grant funding and a zero percent interest loan has been secured to fund these projects. The Donna Channel Drainage Improvements Project includes zero percent interest loan and grant funding from the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) Flood Infrastructure Fund (FIF) program and grant funding from the General Land Office (GLO) Community Development Block Grant Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) fund. Travis & Franklin Streets Drainage and Flood Improvements Project is funded solely by the TWDB FIF program, and the Mustang Creek Drainage Improvements Project is funded by the GLO CDBG-MIT.

Project design for the Donna Channel and Mustang Creek Drainage Improvement Projects has been completed and is 60 percent complete for the Travis and Franklin project. Construction start dates for all projects are dependent on TWDB approval of bid documents that are currently under review.

Maps and project information will be on display at the open house, and project team members will be available to answer questions. Those unable

Williamson County to Host Floodplain Open House

Williamson County will be hosting nine open house events to inform Williamson County residents about the Atlas 14 Floodplain Study, beginning on May 29, 2024.



Following numerous severe flooding events during the past several years, Williamson County partnered with the Texas Water Development Board to create the active Atlas 14 Floodplain Study. The study will help identify where flood exposure is located and where prevention measures are needed to save lives and protect property.

Taylor on the Move: Work Resumes on Second and Fourth Streets

Work resumed on Second and Fourth Streets in May. Residents will see increased activity on those streets and should be on alert for lane closures and construction crews.

Fourth Street reconstruction, which has been underway since February 2024, was briefly delayed when the contractor removed asphalt and found a fully intact concrete road with curbs, gutters, inlets, and storm sewer

facilities beneath. The existing old concrete road was unsuitable for rubblizing, requiring the City's geotechnical engineers to revise the pavement structure design, including the removal of all old concrete.

Taylor on the Move is part of the 2022 Infrastructure Bond approved by the Council in a public meeting on December 8, 2022. The construction contract was awarded to Texas Road in the amount of \$4,094,857.40 in June 2023. The total project, which also includes work already complete on Mallard Lane, facilitates numerous improvements, including seal coating, asphalt repair, pavement reconstruction, street reclamation with new surface asphalt, signage, striping, and traffic control for City Streets. The improvements are intended to repair, protect, and maintain the longevity of the pavement, make the streets safer for Taylor residents and visitors, and implement multi-modal components of the Envision Taylor Comprehensive Plan.
