MESSAGE FROM THE CITY MANAGER

It's hard to believe how quickly this year has flown by--October marks the beginning of the new fiscal year for the City. The FY2025 budget process reflected the City's focus on efficiency and conservative finance.

We achieved a 6% reduction in the tax rate with the new rate of .591368 cents per \$100 valuation, the lowest in Taylor since 1997. It is also the smallest tax rate increase in the County.

This year's budget kicks off several exciting new projects in parks, drainage, streets, and sewer. The Wellness and Recreation Center Feasibility Study includes a community survey where we need your input! You can participate in the survey at TaylorSurvey.org and attend the next public meeting at the Library on November 20 at 6:30pm.

I would like to thank staff and our Finance Department for their diligent work over the last few months in putting together this year's budget, and our City Council for planning ahead and funding projects that will benefit generations to come.

BUDGET BRIEF

FY 24-25 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The FY24-25 Budget Includes....

- \$1 Million in cash-funded Parks Projects
- Market Compensation Study Implementation
- \$1.4 Million in use-tax funded equipment replacement
- 1% decrease in property taxes for operations
- 6% decrease in tax rate
- \$1 Million in cash-funded utility improvements

The 2024 average residential taxable value is \$239,342, a 7.9% increase from 2023.

1/4 of all sales tax collected by the City/EDC is used to reduce property taxes. The Property Tax rate is reduced by 27¢, reducing the burden for the average homeowner by \$647.

Public Meeting Recap

The first public meeting meeting about the Wellness and Recreation Center Feasibility Study was a huge success. We had over 65 people in attendance and received invaluable input that will be included in the final results of the study. At the event, participants learned about the scope of the study, who is involved, the timeline, and opportunities for public participation. They also made their voices heard during a collaborative exercise where they wrote answers to questions on sticky notes and prioritized programming and recreation spaces around the room. The next public meeting will be held at 6:30 PM on November 20th at the Library.

Public Survey


The public survey is now live! We have two surveys running simultaneously. The first is a scientifically valid survey with a random sampling of the community asked to participate to get a general idea of the community's thoughts and opinions. We are also providing a publicly accessible survey for everyone to participate in who are interested. The goal of this survey is to get the thoughts and opinions of those who care the most about the subject. These results will be presented at the next public meeting on November 20.

What is next for the project?

The next step in the project includes the public survey and recreation center tours. Our steering committee, selected by the City Council, along with staff and our consultants will be touring a variety of recreation centers in the DFW area to see what works, what doesn't work, and identify things that they would like to see in Taylor and things that they do not want to see. These tours will be held on October 23-24.

HIGHWAY 79 SEWER MAIN

Project Overview


The Highway 79 Sewer Main is a two-phase project underway in collaboration with Taylor EDC who is funding design and construction.

Phase 1

Phase 1 includes approximately 5,100 feet of 24 inch sewer line pictured below in red that will serve development around the airport with a capacity of five million gallons per day. The total cost for Phase 1 is estimated at \$7.5 Million. Construction is expected to begin in mid-2025 and take almost two years.

Phase 2

Phase 2 will extend the 24 inch sewer line almost to County Road 101. Preliminary design work was approved at the September 26 City Council meeting. The route, distance, location, cost, and timeline will be developed as a part of the preliminary design phase.
