
New Code Enforcement Supervisor

Project Updates



Doris Roznovak Aquatic Center

Park goers may have noticed some changes at Murphy Park. The pool in the Doris Roznovak Aquatic Center is completely gone!

Construction crews began on January 2 and have been hard at work to remove the old pools to make way for a new and much improved facility.

Road Projects

TH Johnson Drive and West Lake Drive will soon receive a facelift. Both roadways are in need of work to maintain good driving conditions for the thousands of residents who drive on them every year. TH Johnson will receive full depth reclamation and resurfacing. West Lake Drive will receive spot reclamation and full resurfacing. Our road programs currently focus on keeping our good roads good and improving the worst of our roads. These two projects are part of the effort to keep good roads good.



Mustang Creek Drainage Improvements

The Mustang Creek Drainage Improvements project will provide additional overbank flood storage through a channel flood bench and mitigate the erosion issue through stabilization of approximately 350 feet of streambank. The primary purpose of this project is to provide roughly 20 acre-feet of additional floodplain storage for the benefit of downstream residents. This project is grant funded. Construction began in January and will take approximately 5 Months.

Airport Fuel Depot

Taylor Municipal Airport will soon see the long awaited fuel depot completed. The old fuel depot failed in March of 2023. There have been some delays throughout the project but it is finally here! The airport is crazy busy with activity increasing over 200% in the last two years rising to over 52,000 take-offs/landings, an average of 143 each day. Over the same period, our fuel sales have dropped in half due to the fuel depot loss. The new depot is just waiting on power from Oncor for full operations.
