



MESSAGE FROM THE CITY MANAGER

As another year comes to a close, now is the perfect time to reflect on all the improvements we've accomplished together as a community in 2025.

This year, we made significant progress on updating our roadways as part of the Taylor Streets Project. Work included resurfacing and striping on TH Johnson Drive, Bill Pickett Trail, Lake Drive, and Mallard Lane, along with improvements to 2nd and 4th streets. These upgrades will help extend the life and reliability of these key roadways.

Work is underway on Phase 1 of the Bull Branch upsizing project, which will provide a much-needed increase to sewer main capacity between 7th Street and MLK Jr. Boulevard. In addition, the City purchased a building that will serve as the new home of our Public Works Department.

Looking ahead to 2026, the City of Taylor will celebrate its Sesquicentennial—a year-long commemoration of our rich history that began with the railroad in 1876. In the coming weeks, we'll share a special announcement highlighting the events and activities planned for this milestone year.

As 2025 winds down, I look forward to building on our momentum and continuing our work to make Taylor a vibrant, welcoming place to live, work, and play. Taylor may be turning 150 in 2026, but we're just getting started!



HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

From the Taylor Fire Department



The Taylor Fire Department wishes you and your family a very Merry Christmas! To help keep your holidays merry and bright, here are a few safety tips to keep in mind:

While decorating:

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame-resistant or flame-retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other flammable items.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections.
- Read manufacturer's instructions for the number of light strands to connect.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.

Holiday Entertaining:

- Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.

Traveling:

- Prepare your car for winter and keep an emergency kit with you.
- Get a good night's sleep before departing and avoid drowsy driving.
- Leave early, planning for heavy traffic.
