City-wide Fall Clean Up

It's time for the community's fall clean up event on Saturday, October 22 from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m.

Once again the City is encouraging volunteers and local civic groups to help pick up trash throughout the city, especially along main thoroughfares and in their neighborhoods.

The City will host two collection sites that are free for residents to use. These are the same sites as last year at 1424 North Main Street in the Public Works yard and at 1200 Welch Street near Hidalgo Park. Proof of city residency may be required.

Also, the City Recycling Center at 1606 N. Main behind Walgreen's is open 24/7 for single stream recycling items. No hazardous waste will be accepted.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

A special Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day is being hosted by Williamson County and Waste Management on Saturday, October 29 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the East Williamson County Event Center at the Taylor Regional Park, 210 N. Carlos G. Parker Boulevard.

Residents are encouraged to take advantage of this household hazardous waste clean-up day. Accepted items include acids, antifreeze, batteries, cleaning products, lawn and garden chemicals, used motor oil and filters, paint, lighter fluid, pool chemicals and computer-related items such as monitors and more.

Robinson Park Pavilion Ready for Use


The newest addition to Fannie Robinson Park has been completed and is ready for use.
