

The Parks & Recreation Department took advantage of good weather over the winter to repaint basketball goals in all of the parks. A little paint made a big difference in the appearance of the goals.

STREET SIGNS REPLACED



Public Works has replaced rusty poles and faded street signs using \$8,000 in Fiscal Year 2017 funding and \$4,569 from a Williamson County 911 addressing grant. The funding has allowed 231 signs to be purchased.

TRASH TID BITS

Did you know the City of Taylor offers curbside bulky waste pick up on your regular trash day? Things like sofas, stoves, water tanks, furniture and like debris may be placed at your curb on trash pick-up day.

What about tree trimmings? Can you place those out on trash day? YES! Shrubs and brush trimmings can be placed on your curb as long as they are bundled and tied. They also should be no longer than 4 feet in length and 2 feet in diameter.

For a bulky item pick up on your regular trash day just call 512-352-2066 to give notice a week in advance. One bulky item per week, please.
