- Sassy Lassi has opened

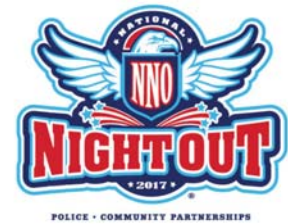

2017-2018 RATES AND FEES FUND IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements and repairs are underway at the Taylor Wastewater Treatment Plant, to the tune of \$2.25 million. Funding from the water and sewer fees in part help cover repairs and the costs of providing water and sewer services to residents. In addition, crews are replacing old water lines, and repairs on the pump stations are due to be made.

For 2017-2018, the water rates will increase by 8%, while the sewer rates increase by 12%. This means the monthly minimum for water goes to \$31.31 compared to \$28.99, for buildings with a 5/8" x 3/4" meter size, typical for most residential homes. The per-gallon rate for the first 2,000 gallons of water is \$3.18.

Sewer rates will increase from \$25 to \$28 monthly minimum charge for a 5/8" x 3/4" meter size, plus \$6.71 per 1,000 gallons of water use. The new rates will appear on the bill that includes October 1, 2017, which will be prorated accordingly.

Zone 2: Sept. 1 to Oct. 2 -- Bill Date of Oct. 12

Zone 3: Sept. 11 to Oct. 12 -- Bill Date of Oct. 19

Zone 4: Sept. 18 to Oct. 19 -- Bill Date of Oct. 26

IN AN EMERGENCY, EVERY SECOND COUNTS! DISPLAY YOUR 9-1-1 ADDRESS FOR SAFETY

A well-marked location is easier for Law Enforcement, Fire and Emergency Medical Personnel, Utility Services and Mail Services to quickly locate. It is essential that a home or business display its street address prominently, either on a mailbox, the building or painted on a curb's edge.

Even if a home or business is close to the road, displaying the address number on both the house/ business and the driveway entrance will help emergency personnel find it without a problem.

Display your address number with large lettering that can easily be read from the street or road during both day and night. Choose a color that contrasts with the background. Always display numbers horizontally. Reflective numbers are also very helpful. Please make sure that foliage growth does not obscure the location of the residence or business.
