The City of Taylor requires residents to register their pets with the City.


Pets can be registered at the Water Department at City Hall, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Proof of rabies

vaccination is required to register a pet.

Fees for pet registration are:

- Dog/cat altered (spayed or neutered) -- \$5
- Dog/cat unaltered -- \$15
