City Manager Message

Last month, the City was impacted by Winter Storm Mara that brought us several rounds of rain and freezing precipitation. Many residents experienced power outages and since the storm, we have continued clean up efforts due to downed tree branches and brush.

I want to take this time to thank our City staff for the amazing job they did during this storm. Our Public Works and Parks and Recreation crews were out clearing debris in roadways. Our Water and Wastewater team was able to ensure the water systems

stayed operational throughout the power outages. And our police and fire departments continued to respond to emergency calls throughout the event. I can't thank our team enough for their leadership and dedication during this winter storm.

We made sure to implement an Emergency Operations Center that met several times through out the day during the event to provide updates and push out vital information to our residents. And after the winter storm passed, our Public Works Department continued to coordinate to quickly set up a debris drop-off point for residents that were beginning clean up efforts and coordinated with getting CTC Disaster Response to bring in trucks to begin picking up debris from residents' homes and businesses.

The City has endured several of these winter storm events in the past few years and I continue to be impressed and proud of the work of our City staff. I've said it many times before, but the staff here at the City of Taylor is truly a group of dedicated individuals that I am proud to work with every day. I can't thank them enough for their hard work not just when a crisis happens but day in and day out.

Members of the Taylor community, City of Taylor Parks and Recreation Department, Good Life Taylor, Taylor Chamber of Commerce and City Council celebrated the official opening of Percussion Park, located inside Murphy Park, with a ribbon cutting ceremony on Saturday, Feb. 18.

Ribbon Cutting Held for Percussion Park Feb. 18

The City of Taylor Parks and Recreation Department, in partnership with Good Life Taylor, held an official ribbon cutting ceremony for Percussion Park on Saturday, Feb. 18. The playground is located in Murphy Park between the lake and the swimming pool.

The concept for the playground was originally brought to the City by Good Life Taylor, an organization founded in 2012 to promote healthy families and outdoor activities. The playground was created in the shape of a musical treble clef and features an ensemble of functioning musical playground pieces. The idea was to create a vibrant, creative, musical space within the City's parks system where people of all ages can gather, create music, and enjoy the outdoors.

Funding for Percussion Park was made possible in part by a grant from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Local Park Grant Program that was approved by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission in August 2020. Additional funds were provided through donations raised by Good Life Taylor and a portion of the City of Taylor 2018 Bond Fund. SEC Planning was hired to design the playground, installation was done by Kraftsman Commercial Playgrounds and landscaping was completed by LandArt America. Bids were approved by Council in February 2022 and construction began in April 2022.

In addition to the ribbon cutting ceremony, the organization Soulshine Rhythm Experience brought drums and other instruments for attendees to play and led the group in some fun drum and rhythm exercises. We would like to thank everyone for coming out and helping us celebrate!



February Sales Tax Numbers

The City of Taylor has released the actual and cumulative sales tax numbers for the month of February and posted them to the City's website. The sales and use tax revenue reported for the City in February 2023 was \$2,494,516, an increase of more than \$1.8 million (267%) over the same time last year. The cumulative sales and use tax revenue through February 2023 is \$8,164,224, an increase of over \$5.5 million (210.8%) over the same period in 2021. In November 2022, the City began releasing a report on the third Tuesday of every month detailing the cumulative and actual numbers from the last four months of the year and compare them to the three prior years.

Increased sales tax revenue is a positive for Taylor residents for several reasons. A majority of the revenue in the City's General Fund is made up of ad valorem, or property tax that is charged to residents, and sales and use tax that is charged to anyone who purchases goods and services in the City. When sales and use tax revenues are up, it can help lower the property tax rate. Between the increased construction use taxes from the Samsung Semiconductor construction project, and an influx of visitors and businesses in our City, the City has seen an upward trend in sales and use tax numbers that we expect will continue in the coming years.

Warrant Round-up April 1

The Taylor Municipal Court will be participating in a warrant round-up on Saturday, April 1. Court will be open from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. while officers go door-to-door. Defendants that come in voluntarily will not be arrested.

All warrant fees will be waived if a defendant pays in full between March 1 and April 1. The court will also offer assistance to those who may not be able to pay in full and will work out an agreeable action for anyone who is willing to make the effort to come in and clear up their warrants.
