Brush Pickup Limits

Please be reminded that in order for brush to be picked up at the curb of a residence, it must be cut to no more than four foot lengths and placed at the curb the same day as regular garbage pickup.

Up to five cubic yards of unbundled brush will be picked up once a week. Five cubic yards is equivalent to four foot lengths stacked approximately four feet high and eight feet wide.

Bulk items such as mattresses, sofas and most household items also are picked up once a week on the regular pickup day.
