City Council To Receive Economic Impact Award

The Austin Business Journal has awarded the Taylor City Council the Economic Impact Award for the Taylor community for its contribution to the economic growth of Taylor. The Council will be recognized along with other community recipients at the Williamson County Growth Summit on November 3.

The Taylor Marketing Team nominated the City Council for its leadership and the bold steps it has taken to position Taylor for economic growth which has begun and is expected to intensify during the next five years. Some of the specific actions cited in the nomination included:

- Adoption of a new business incentives policy that focuses on attracting clean energy companies and businesses that bring jobs with average annual salaries of \$50,000 or more.
- Improvements at Taylor Municipal Airport with new hangars and acquisition of additional land for runway expansion.
- Capital investments of \$5.2 million for expanded wastewater interceptor and \$9 million for upper pressure plane for new water towers and ground storage for expanding water needs and future growth.
- Completion of \$2.5 million downtown streetscape and signalization projects in Taylor's Historic Downtown District.

- Becoming a formal partner in the East Williamson County Higher Education Center (EWCHEC) with a funding commitment of \$125,000 in 2008-09.
- Completion of \$500,000 Murphy Park and Hike & Bike improvements and \$400,000 for Robinson Park.
- Completion of new Central Fire Station and Taylor Public Library with proceeds from a \$5 million General Obligation bond election.
- Construction of new 70-acre East Williamson County Regional Park and Sports Complex with approximately \$8 million in state and local funds that will be a major draw for regional sports events.

The Taylor Marketing Team includes Taylor Independent School District, Taylor CNET, Taylor Economic Development Corporation, Taylor Chamber of Commerce and the City of Taylor.

ALCOA Foundation Gift

The ALCOA Foundation has donated \$15,000 to help garner funds required to apply for a Housing Trust Fund grant. The Housing Trust Fund grant is \$250,000 that will provide for weatherization of approximately six to eight homes in Taylor.

The City of Taylor is partnering with Williamson-Burnet Counties Opportunities (WBCO) to apply for the grant in early 2009. The City has agreed to help raise \$50,000 towards this goal and ALCOA Foundation is the first donor. The money raised will be used to fund the administration of the program and the initial grant request.
