

How can I report damage to my property or surrounding infrastructure?

What are the current damages in the city?

As of today, the Taylor Fire Department, Police Department and Public Works Department have finalized damage assessments throughout the city. City Manager Isaac Turner has released a memorandum highlighting the efforts and actions taken by the city to address the needs and concerns of our community members. Based on the assessments, we are committed to meeting the timelines and parameters set for repairing critical infrastructure and bringing the City back to normalcy within the shortest timeline possible.

Are there any road closures in the city?

County Road 198, South Rio Grande Street, the 600 Block of Kimbro Street, one shoulder of Lorax Lane and the 200-300 Block of Talbot Street are currently closed. CR 101 and CR 369 have been reopened. As the city works diligently to address the needs of our community members and the damages throughout Taylor from the storms, we will continue to update the community with any road closures or openings as they become available.

What are the closed facilities within the city?

Because of the extent and range of damage to our parks system, the City of Taylor has chosen to close all parks until further notice pending their restoration to the quality expected by our citizens and visitors.

Were there any injuries or deaths because of the storm?

We are happy to state that we had no reports of injury or death.

Where were the shelters established during the storm? Is there anywhere we can go now if we need assistance?

A temporary shelter was established at City Hall in Taylor for residents in need. A total of eleven citizens were later transported via Taylor ISD buses to another rescue shelter at the Hutto Middle School where they were assisted by Red Cross personnel. All personnel have returned to Taylor today.

The Oasis Church located at 1616 Granger Road in Taylor will be providing temporary shelter for those in need of a place to stay. They are also offering food, clothing and showers for residents affected by the storm.

Where can we put our debris and is the city going to be picking it up for us?

Beginning Wednesday, May 27, trash and debris can be brought to the City drop-off site at the public works yard on Main Street or the City's cleanup site on Welch Street. If individuals are unable to haul debris to these sites, curbside pickup will take place on your regular trash day for limbs or debris less than four feet long

How can citizens help going forward?

Supply donations are currently being accepted at Oasis Church for families seeking shelter. The Red Cross will be available in Taylor for the rest of the week to help community members in need.

Do you have a detailed list of responses to the weather?

- The Taylor Fire Department and Police Department responded to multiple calls for assistance during the storms.
 - The Taylor PD responded to 137 storm-related calls and increased their patrol size from 4 initial officers to 21 officers on duty during the storm period.
 - The Taylor FD have conducted street by street and house by house assessments since early this morning and completed their initial assessments.
- 1 temporary shelter was opened at City Hall
 - An additional shelter has been established for residents needing assistance at the Oasis Church located at 1616 Granger Rd in Taylor.
- An emergency alert system via Blackboard Connect was used to notify citizens of significant weather and or warnings
- County Road 198, South Rio Grande Street, the 600 Block of Kimbro Street, one shoulder of Lorax Lane and the 200-300 Block of Talbot Street are currently closed. CR 101 and CR 369 have been reopened.

- The Taylor airport has been closed due to the severe weather and flooding but City officials have been working diligently to clear the runway and taxiways and hope to have the facility opened later this evening.
